

Summary of Maktabat al-Fanoos (Lantern Library) Survey 2016-2017

Maktabat al-Fanoos served about 90,000 children in 2016-2017, with each child receiving eight books, delivered to the classroom. Price Philanthropies and Keren Grinspoon Israel, who partner with the Ministry of Education in carrying out Maktabat al-Fanoos, commissioned a survey of teachers' assessment of books used in the program in 2016-2017, teachers' use of the program's Facebook page, and sought to identify any delivery problems. The survey was conducted by random phone to 345 teachers throughout Israel (i.e. 12% of those in the program).

- By and large the teachers liked the books, with 75% of teachers ranking all the book their class received at the highest levels (4 and 5 on a scale of 1–5).
- The most popular books for the younger children were <u>Mummy and Me</u> (by Emma Chichester Clark) and <u>The Mouse and the Apple</u> (by Stephen Butler). The most popular books for the older children were <u>Where Do I Go When I'm Angry</u> (by Malak Abu-Raya), and <u>Sa'ad's New Haircut</u> (by Olof and Lena Landstrom).
- Book delivery was largely smooth. Some 14% of teachers reported a problem with delivery, but in 96% of these cases, problems were solved -- usually by calling or emailing Maktabat al-Fanoos offices.
- 55% of the teachers said they were aware of the program's Facebook page and looked at the page. Of those using Facebook, about 30% looked at program updates on Facebook at least once a week; the rest said they visited the page about once a month or less.
- Of those who did not use the Facebook page, 70% said it was because they do not have Facebook accounts; 12% said it was because they were not aware of the page, and 24% said it was due to lack of time. Only one teacher said she had no interest in seeing the Facebook page.

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
